# HEADINGLEY

### ROAD CLOSURES

The Rob Burrow Leeds Marathon takes place on Sunday 14 May 2023 and will require road closures and parking restrictions in your area. Over 12,000 participants will take on the 26.2-mile course, which starts and finishes at Headingley Stadium. The circular marathon route will take in some of Leeds most scenic countryside and outer suburbs, journeying around Woodhouse Moor before travelling up through Headingley, Adel, Pool in Wharfedale, Otley and Bramhope and back for the big finish.

This leaflet provides specific access details for Headingley residents.

The marathon will start on St Michael's Lane in Headingley, outside the entrance to Headingley Stadium, and will also see participants coming back in along the lane before entering the stadium to finish on the pitch. The closures along St Michael's Lane will go in from 0400 until 1830.

Closures around Headingley and Far Headingley will start to be implemented from 0730/0800. Roads will re-open as soon as it is safe to do so and the final runners have passed through the area, at approximately 1645 / 1700.

### ACCESS / EGRESS

St Michael's Lane will be shut to vehicles between 0400 – 1830 and pedestrians between 0800 - 1030 on Sunday 14th. Residents will be required to apply for a Residents Pass for pedestrian access only so that we can maintain pedestrian access throughout.

Newport View between St Michael's Lane and Newport Crescent is also being used for participant holding areas from 0800, so this area will also be closed off to pedestrians (other than those with resident passes) and vehicles too.

Vehicle access and egress from St Michael's Lane will be restricted between 0730 – 1130, after this point Headingley Lane will reopen with access to and from the city centre.

An egress lane will be implemented from Kepstorn Road onto Spenneth Road, this lane will be temporarily removed between 1230 – 1430.

## VEHICLE CROSSING POINT

There are points across the route indicated [here](#) where we will facilitate vehicle crossing points, these are as follows;

- Church Wood Avenue to Glen Road until 0910 and then under marshal supervision from 1115.

## PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Any vehicles parked on the route will be removed. Please assist us by moving your vehicle off the route on the evening of Saturday 13 May. If your vehicle is relocated by event contractors, please contact Run For All.

There will be parking suspensions and no waiting restrictions implemented to facilitate vehicular drop off loops at two locations;

Drop off arriving from the East – Grove Lane onto Shaw Lane

Drop off arriving from the West – Beechwood Crescent onto St Michael's Lane

## BUSINESS & TRANSPORT

We hope that businesses will remain open as usual on the day and have been in touch with them to encourage them to remain open with the expectation of large numbers of spectators watching across the marathon route. Please check with the businesses that they will be open prior to visiting them.

Some bus services will be displaced and diverted by the marathon route, therefore we advise that you check via one of the following methods, prior to travel;

- Bus service providers website (i.e. First Bus)
- West Yorkshire Combined Authority website – will detail bus diversions and alterations
- Bus stops will advise of changes to normal services
